TESTING BRIEF

Spring 2009 Georgia High School Graduation Tests in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science March 16 – April 3, 2009

Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §20-2-281 G, (a) mandates that a "curriculum-based assessment be administered in grade 11 for graduation purposes" and (c) "that the State Board of Education shall have the authority to condition the awarding of a high school diploma to a student upon achievement of satisfactory scores on instruments or tests adopted and administered by the State board pursuant to (a) of this code."

The Georgia High School Graduation Tests (GHSGT) assess only a sample of the knowledge and skills that educators agree comprise a complete high school education. Georgia students have opportunities to learn – and are expected to master – much more than the tests address. The state adopted curriculum is the source of the knowledge and skills assessed on the graduation tests.

Students take the GHSGT for the first time in the spring of the 11th grade. Schools use the results to identify students who need additional instruction in the academic content determined by Georgia educators as necessary for a high school diploma. Students who do not succeed on their first attempt have four additional opportunities to meet the standards prior to completing 12th grade.

Administration of the GHSGT supports Goal 1 of the Superintendent's Strategic Plan: Increase high school graduation rate, decrease high-school dropout rate, and increase post-secondary enrollment rate. This is achieved through providing an effective curriculum and assessment system designed to improve student achievement.

KEY FINDINGS

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

- o Ninety (90) percent of Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard for English Language Arts. This represents a one (1) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Ninety-three (93) percent of Regular Program Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. There is no change from 2008 to 2009.
- o Fifty-six (56) percent of Special Education Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a one (1) percentage point decrease from 2008.
- o Fifty-nine (59) percent of English Language Learner Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a six (6) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- The percent of students (54%) who achieved Advanced Proficiency or Honors, and are therefore considered college/work ready, increased one (1) percentage point over 2008. The percent of students (14%) who achieved Honors, the highest performance level, increased four (4) percentage points over 2008.
- o The 2009 Strategic Plan target for English Language Arts was ninety-seven (97) percent. This target was not met.

MATHEMATICS

- O Ninety-four (94) percent of Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard for Mathematics. This represents a one (1) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Ninety-six (96) percent of Regular Program Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a one (1) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Sixty-three (63) percent of Special Education Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a four (4) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Eighty-three (83) percent of English Language Learner Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a three (3) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o The 2009 Strategic Plan target for Mathematics achievement was ninety-four (94) percent. This target was met.

SOCIAL STUDIES

- o Eighty-seven (87) percent of Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard for Social Studies. This represents a one (1) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Ninety (90) percent of Regular Program Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a one (1) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Fifty-six (56) percent of Special Education Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a three (3) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Sixty-two (62) percent of English Language Learner Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents an eleven (11) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- O The 2009 Strategic Plan target for Social Studies achievement was eighty-six (86) percent. This target was exceeded.

SCIENCE

- o Eighty-eight (88) percent of Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard for Science. This represents a two (2) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Ninety-one (91) percent of Regular Program Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a two (2) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Fifty-five (55) percent of Special Education Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a three (3) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- o Sixty (60) percent of English Language Learner Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers met or exceeded the passing standard. This represents a one (1) percentage point increase in achievement over 2008.
- The percent of students (51%) who achieved Advanced Proficiency or Honors increased one (1) percentage point over 2008. The percent of students (15%) who achieved Honors, the highest performance level, increased three (3) percentage points over 2008.
- The 2009 Strategic Plan target for Science achievement was eighty-six (86) percent. This target was exceeded.



Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers that Achieved Pass and Pass Plus in Mathematics 2008-2009



Percent of 11th Grade First-Time Test Takers that Achieved Pass and Pass Plus in Social Studies 2008-2009




Percent Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers Passing GHSGT English Language Arts 2008-2009



Percent Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Mathematics 2008-2009



Percent Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Social Studies 2008-2009



Percent Grade 11 First-Time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Science 2008-2009


