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2009-2010 Executive Summary of Charter Schools Annual Report 2009-2010

Charter schools moved to the forefront of the national and state educational reform agendas during the 2009-2010 school year. Both President Obama and Secretary of Education Arne Duncan stressed the importance of providing school choice to parents and pledged increased funding for charter schools. Additionally, Georgia received one of the 12 Federal Race to the Top grants. The strength of each state's charter school law and sector was a critical part of the Race to the Top application process.

Additional national attention came from the National Center for Educational Reform which this year gave Georgia a "C" for its charter school law. In 2009, Georgia received a "B". The study cited the lack of a truly independent authorizer and the limited number of new charter schools that Georgia added over the last year as reasons why Georgia received a lower grade in 2010.

In 2010, Georgia received its fourth federal Public Charter Schools Program grant. Georgia was one of only 12 states to receive the competitive grant. Georgia was awarded \$13 million for two years. It is anticipated that Georgia will fund approximately 40 new charter schools during the two-year grant program. The new grant will increase the implementation grant funding levels for new charter schools and create incentives for charter school developers to locate in rural or low-performing districts. For the first time since 2004, the Georgia Department of Education will be able to offer federal planning grants to recently approved charter schools. Planning grants will enable new charter schools to develop curriculum, provide professional development and governance training.

The state continued to provide funding for two specific charter school grants: planning and facilities. The planning grant provides potential charter school developers with grant funds to help develop a charter petition. Approved charter schools can apply for a facility grant. Facility grants can be used to help improve charter school facilities and improve the safety of school buildings. Even as state funding for the facilities grant was reduced due to statewide budget reductions, a record X number of charter schools applied for the facility grant. Many charter schools faced leaner budgets this year as a result of QBE cuts, so the number of charter schools seeking supplemental financial assistance increased.

Authorized by 2008 legislation, the Georgia Charter Schools Commission held its third application round. The Commission received 23 applications: 4 virtual charter schools and 19 "bricks and mortar" schools. The Commission established a high quality charter authorizing process that used national best practices as a guide. The Commission also approved two statewide virtual charter schools in June. The virtual schools anticipated opening for the 2011-2012 school year if an acceptable funding level is available.

The Georgia Department of Education's Charter Schools Division (CSD) increased the amount of technical assistance and training offered to new and existing charter schools. The CSD provided workshops on grant writing and management, developing a charter school, career academies, charter school employment law, and Title III requirements. The CSD anticipates expanding its training opportunities over the next year to include financial management, special education, gifted education and legal requirements for charter schools.

The CSD increased the rigor of the charter school renewal process. Charter schools seeking to renew their charter were asked to provide academic data for the length of its previous charter term. The CSD partnered with the Georgia Department of Education's accountability division to analyze and assess each renewal applicant's academic performance. To comply with federal law, the CSD will continue to consider a charter school's academic performance as the most important factor when reviewing a renewal petition.

Things to look for in 2011

The Georgia Department of Education (Department) expects to revise the charter school rule in the early months of 2011. Additionally, the Department will continue to develop training opportunities for petitioners and existing charter schools. The Department will also embark on providing training and guidance for local authorizers.


This Annual Report is compiled by the Georgia Department of Education under the leadership of the State Superintendent of Schools Brad Bryant and provided to the General Assembly by December 31. The report is divided into three sections:

- A general overview of the Georgia charter school sector including a demographic overview, including enrollment numbers, student population served, distribution of charter schools across the state and an analysis of student performance data;
- Individual school and system reports that provide information on enrollment, AYP achievement, academic performance and achievement of goals; and
- A summary of individual start-up charter school audited financial statements.


1. Georgia Charter School Performance

Over the past two years, a number of academic studies have examined the relative academic performance of charter schools compared to their traditional public school counterparts. While none of the studies are conclusive, the Georgia Department of Education has increased the academic oversight of its charter schools. The data and analysis included in this report is generated by the Georgia Department of Education's data collections, accountability and policy divisions. The information was compiled by the Charter Schools Division.

The number of charter schools operating in Georgia has continued to increase, with a total of 121 charter schools and programs. As of this 2009-2010 report, the two authorizers in Georgia, the State Board of Education and the Georgia Charter Schools Commission have granted 135 charters since 1995. Fourteen charter schools are expected to open for the 2010-2011 school year. Four school districts became new charter systems at the beginning of the 2010-2011 school year and are not included in this report.



Georgia has two types of charter schools: start-ups and conversions. Start-up charter schools are new schools that did not exist prior to receiving a charter. Conversion charter schools existed as a traditional public school prior to receiving a charter school. Until 1998, conversion charter schools were the only type of charter allowed in Georgia. With the passing of the amended Georgia Charter Schools Act in 1998, start-up charters quickly became the most common type of charter school in Georgia. Today 54% of charter schools are start-up schools.




There are a number of varieties of charter schools within both types of charter. A conversion charter school can be either a single school located within a traditional school district or an entire system of schools that converted. The charter option is commonly referred to as a charter system. Since 2007, four charter systems have been operating in Georgia: Decatur City Schools, Gainesville City Schools, Marietta City Schools and Warren County Schools.


Within the start-up category, charter schools can be distinguished by their authorizer. Start-up charter schools authorized by their local district and the State Board of Education are commonly referred to as LEA start-ups. Start-up charter schools authorized by only the State Board of Education are known as State Chartered Special schools. Start-up charter schools authorized by the Georgia Charter Schools Commission are commonly referred to as Commission charter schools. All three types share many of the same challenges when creating a brand new school. The majority of start-up charter schools within Georgia are authorized by both the local district and the State Board of Education.

Additionally, there is a special type of locally approved charter school commonly referred to as a career academy. Career academies partner with the local school system, a technical college and local businesses to create a school or program that provides relevant technical training and courses to high school students. There are 19 charter career academies in Georgia. The career academies without fulltime enrollment are excluded from the academic and descriptive charts in this report.


In 2008-2009, Georgia experienced a dramatic increase in the percentage of students enrolled in a charter school as a result of the four charter systems converting their schools to charter schools. While the number of students enrolled in a charter school roughly doubled from 33,229 to 64,949 students in last year's report, the number declined slightly to 62,303 in 2009-2010. The overall percentage of Georgia students enrolled in a charter school is still very small at 4%.




Charter schools have been smaller than their traditional public school counterparts. In 2009, Georgia experienced a growth in the average enrollment of charter schools. This trend continued in 2009-2010. While the majority of charter schools still have fewer than 500 students, the growth of existing schools coupled with the four charter systems caused the average school size to increase. The number of schools serving students with more than 500 students increased from 40 to 48 in the 2009-2010 school year. All the charter schools that enroll fewer than 100 students are start-up charter schools.




Additionally, charter school distribution is heavily clustered in the greater metro-Atlanta area. Excluding charter systems, the four districts- Cobb County Schools, DeKalb County Schools, Fulton County Schools and Atlanta Public Schools- with the largest number of charter schools did not create any new charter schools this year. Only five districts located outside the metro Atlanta area have three or more charter schools: Dougherty County Schools, Hall County Schools, Morgan County Schools, Muscogee County Schools and Savannah-Chatham Schools. Of these, only Savannah-Chatham Schools has authorized a start-up charter school.




In terms of gender and racial composition, charter schools in Georgia are equally likely to enroll as many male students as female students and are somewhat more likely to enroll racial minorities. Racial minorities comprise 64% of all charter schools compared to 55% statewide.





During the 2009-2010 school year, 52% of students enrolled in charter schools qualified for the free and reduced lunch program (FRL) compared to 56% statewide. This represents a decline in the percentage of FRL-eligible students in charter schools. Nationwide trends show that charter schools on average enroll a less affluent population than traditional public schools enroll.



2. Charter School Student Performance


As noted in previous Annual Reports, the issue of whether students enrolled in charter schools perform better than they would have performed had they attended traditional public schools is difficult to answer because there is no data to determine how well they would have done had they stayed in traditional public schools. Additionally, many of Georgia's charter school students enter a charter school in kindergarten and have no prior experience in a traditional public school setting. However, the information presented in this report can provide a basic level of understanding of how charter schools are performing.

A. Adequate Yearly Progress Comparisons

Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) is an achievement measure that determines whether a school's performance met the annual targets in various subjects and grade levels. AYP figures provide an measure of whether a school is improving from year to year.

- 80 % of charter schools made AYP for the 2009-2010 school year
- Two out of four charter systems made AYP in 2009-2010
- 2 charter schools made AYP in 2009-2010 after failing to make it in 2008-2009
- 1 new start-ups made AYP in their first year of operation

In 2009-2010, Georgia charter schools made AYP at a rate slightly higher than traditional public schools. Over the past five years, Georgia charter schools have performed similarly to their traditional public school counterparts at the aggregate level. Examining the charter school data by type of charter school increases our understanding of how charter schools are performing throughout the state.




A more complete picture appears if charter schools are divided into three categories: conversion, start-up and system. Start up charter schools performed slightly worse than conversion schools. Of the 42 start-ups, 31 made AYP with an overall AYP rate of 73%. Out of the 11 start-ups that did not make AYP, only one is in Needs Improvement Status. This is a reversal from last year's performance in which 84% of all start-up charter schools made AYP.

Conversion school performance is somewhat stronger than start-up performance. Approximately 78% of conversion charter schools have made AYP for at least 3 consecutive years, a rate somewhat lower than start up schools. In addition, several conversion charters have found success using chartering as a turnaround strategy. Failing public schools can apply for a charter as a way to use flexibility and innovation to improve student performance. Moreover, of the seven conversion schools that did not make AYP, four are high schools and two are using chartering as a turnaround strategy.

Two charter systems made AYP in 2009-2010: Decatur City Schools and Marietta City Schools. For the third consecutive year, Warren County School District failed to make AYP based on Warren County High School's academic performance and graduation rate. Gainesville City Schools failed to make AYP for the first time in a number of years.

B. State High School Graduation Rate



The Georgia charter high school graduation rate continued to decline in 2009-2010. Because of the way high school graduation rates are reported, however, this statistic does not capture the effect of all charter high schools. Georgia has experienced a rapid two-year increase in the number of career academies statewide—there are now 19 approved career academies in Georgia, up from only six two years ago. Career academies are charter schools that partner with local school systems to offer relevant career specific training and increase local school systems graduation rates. These career academies have experienced remarkable success, with reported graduation rates for career academy students above 90% for all but one of the nineteen career academy schools. Because career academies are programs rather than schools, however, this increase in the graduation rate is reported through the traditional high school and is not included in the charter school graduation rate, thus creating a somewhat artificially low graduation rate among charter high schools.


C. Criterion Reference Competency Test Results

Turning to standardized test results, the data reveal that Georgia charter school student performance has improved in most areas over time. The following figures show the performance on the Criterion Referenced Competency Test ("CRCT")¹ subjects over a four-year span: Social Studies,

 $^{^{1}}$ The CRCT test is administered in grades 1-8, while the Georgia High School Graduation Test (GHSGT) is administered to high school students.

English/Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science. Comparison scores for all students enrolled in traditional public schools are provided as well.

Historically, Georgia charter school students have performed at a higher rate than traditional public school students in most CRCT content areas over time. In the past three years, the achievement difference between charter schools and traditional public schools narrowed somewhat and in 2009 reversed. In 2010, charter school students performed slightly better than the state's averages. The following charts compare the percentage of charter school students who passed the Criterion Referenced Competency Test (CRCT) over the past four years with the state averages.





D. Georgia High School Graduation Test Results

Data from 2009-2010 showed a decline in Georgia's charter school high school achievement performance. Over the past four years, charter school students performed slightly better on the Georgia High School Graduation Test than their traditional public high school peers on all subject tests. In 2010, students performed slightly worse than the state's traditional high schools. Note that this data excludes career academy students results.



Relative Performance of Charter Schools Students on GHSGT Compared to State Averages



E. Comparative Achievement Results

The preceding data compares overall charter school student averages against the overall state averages. Because charter school students typically enroll in a local charter school within an existing school district, state averages are limited in their ability to make accurate local comparisons. Another way to examine the data is by determining whether or not charter school students in a given district performed better than other public school students in that same district. One way to examine this question is to determine the percentage of charter school students who either meet or exceed standards and compare that to the average for the district in which the charter school is located.

The following chart depicts the percentage of charter schools whose "meet and exceed rate" is greater than or equal to the average for the district in which the charter is located.



As illustrated above, the majority of charter schools exhibited an overall "meets and exceeds" rate that was higher than that of their district as a whole. The performance was strongest on the GHSGT for Math, in which 70% of charter schools had a passage rate that was higher than their district's average.

This comparison, while certainly more useful than statewide averages, is also somewhat limited by several relevant factors. First, in several Georgia districts, charter school demographics vary quite dramatically from the overall demographics of the district in which the charter school is located. For instance, a charter school might enroll a much higher proportion of English language learners or students with disabilities than the district generally. Comparing such schools to the overall district performance without controlling for relevant variables that affect student achievement might limit the analysis. Likewise, traditional public schools tend to enroll students from a specific attendance zone drawn adjacent to the school itself. While some charter schools utilize this model, a far higher

proportion of charter schools have county-wide attendance zones and some even enroll a substantial number of students from neighboring counties.

A finer level of detail is provided by comparing the percentage of charter school students who either meet or exceed standards to the neighboring school to which the charter schools' students would otherwise be zoned. This largely controls for the first challenge noted above because it locates the charter school within a specific portion of the district, likely the areas from which the charter school will enroll the majority of its students. After all, Georgia parents and students are not selecting among a composite statewide school, a composite district-wide school, and their zoned school. Instead, they are selecting between a specific traditional public school to which the student is zoned and a charter option. In most respects, this is the best comparison to answer the question of how charter schools perform.

Appendix A

Charter Types referred to in this report

- 1. <u>Conversion</u>: a charter school that existed as a local school prior to becoming a charter school. To apply as a conversion, a majority of the faculty and instructional staff members and a majority of parents or guardians of students enrolled in the petitioning school must vote by secret ballot to apply for a charter.
 - a. <u>System Charter School:</u> a charter school that is included in system charter granted by the SBOE.
- 2. <u>Start-up</u>: a charter school created by a petition brought forth by private individuals, private organizations, or a state or local public entity.
 - a. <u>State Chartered Special School:</u> a charter school created as a special school that is operating under the terms of a charter between the charter petitioner and the SBOE. Petitioners may apply to become a state chartered special school if their petition is first denied by the local board and they apply for state chartered special school status to the SBOE. Conversion charter school petitioners may not apply to be state chartered special schools.
 - b. <u>Charter Commission School:</u> a charter school created as an independent school that is operating under terms of a charter between the charter petitioner and the Georgia Charter Schools Commission. Petitioners may apply to become a charter commission school if their petition is denied by their local board or if they draw students from five or more counties. They can then apply to the Georgia Charter Schools Commission. Conversion charter school petitioners may not apply to be ach commission school.

Conversions, start-ups, and system charter schools are under the management and control of their local board, with the SBOE as a third party to the contract. Only state-chartered special schools are under the management and control of the SBOE. Commission schools are managed and monitored by the Georgia Charter Schools Commission.

Testing History

In 2000, the State instituted the first year of the state assessment, the Criterion Referenced Competency Tests (CRCT), for grades four, six, and eight. Spring 2002 and 2004 marked the first operational administrations in all grades, which included English/ Language Arts, Mathematics, and Reading in grades 1 through 8. Science and Social Studies are covered in grades 3 through 8.

Academic Data

From the academic data available on Georgia's public schools, this Report highlights the most useful. To look at progress over time, this Report includes standardized test scores for each charter school, its local district, and the state. This selection of data allows readers to compare the charter school's achievement level to the local district and the State as well as to compare the charter school's

rate of improvement to the local district and state. Further disaggregated data can be found for each charter school on the Governor's Office of Student Achievement website (www.gaosa.org).

<u>Progress Towards Goals and Financial Audit</u>

For locally-approved charter schools, information on academic goals and the financial audit was provided by each charter school. This Report also contains information about the financial condition of each charter school, including whether each school had a surplus at the end of the reporting period and how much each school spent on facilities costs. Charter schools' progress towards the academic goals stated in their charters is important because, in conjunction with state and national accountability systems, charter schools are held accountable for meeting these goals. Strong financial management is a best practice for charter schools.


By the end of third and fifth grades, ninety percent of Addison students will be on or above grade level in reading as meassured by state mandated assessments or other data sources. MET - 98.6 met or exceeded on CRCT in Reading/ELA. From our AYP data on the Georgia CRCT our results show 98.6% of all students met or exceeded on the CRCT in Reading/ELA. All subgroups were above 90% as well in the area of Reading/ELA. Our students with disabilities were our lowest performing sub-group at 93.6%.


Goal 2:



From our AYP data on the Georgia CRCT our results show 92.9% of all students met or exceeded on the CRCT in math. We have one subgroup of 40 or more students in the area of economically disadvantaged. In that subgroup we have 85.5% who met or exceeded math standards. We will be monitoring our sub-groups to increase the number of students who meet or exceed in math.


Goal 3:



We graduated 91% of our students this year, with a post-secondary attendance rate of 80%.

Eighty-seven percent of our students met or exceeded standards on the Language Arts portion of the spring 2010 CRCT. While first, second and fourth grade showed gains, an additional focus has been added to move more students to the exceeds category on the test. Guided reading is being used by teachers in order to help teachers differentiate instruction more effectively. A continued effort to seamlessly integrate technology with instruction continues to make great strides. An increase in the number of Smart Boards, Mimeos, projectors, laptops and other computer technology was made more accessible to students. A traveling substitute teacher team was also used to allow teachers to have common planning times to plan and implement units throughout the school year. This foundation should assist all students as they compete for and succeed in post-secondary educational opportunities.

Leadership, fine arts, rigorous academic and vocational tracks that are aligned from elementary through high school will be established beginning in 2008-2009, which will result in a future increase in the graduation rate. The graduation rate had held between 68%-75% for several years but dipped to a low of 55% in 2006-2007. The goal is that the graduation rate will return to 75% immediately in 2008-2009, but no later than the 2010-2011 school year through 5% increases each year.

Actual Performance: Met goal. The graduation rate in 2008-2009 was 68%. The graduation rate for 2010-2011 was 75.5%.

Goal 3:

Local governance will continue to be maximized through the development and implementation of school governing councils beginning in 2008-2009. Maximizing that ability of parents and guardians as well as community members to participate in the decision –making processes of the school should result in an increase in participation of parents/guardians/community members on the governing councils. This can easily be contrasted to the total lack of involvement in past years on the school councils where a quorum was rarely met.

Actual Performance: Goal Met: Each of the school's has an active Governing Council including parents, staff, and community members. These boards have taken an active part in the hiring process and decision making processes of the schools.

Goal 4:

Parent approval surveys regarding the school system will be administered during the next SACS visit in 2011-2012 and the goal is an 85% approval rate.

Actual Performance: Goal Met: We survey students, parents, teachers, parapros and administrators each year. According to the surveys from 2008-2009 95% of the responses from parents were favorable. According to the surveys from 2009-2010, each school is still well above the 85% approval rate from parents. Further, the surveys from students, parapros, teachers and administrators were all very positive. (Results on file by school at the county office.)

We will be administering the SACS parental surveys in 2011-2012.

Audited Financial Statements

This annual report contains a review of audited financial statements received by the Georgia Department of Education. Start-up charter schools are required to submit audited financial statements to the Department. This year, the Charter Schools Division reviewed and summarized the 29 audited statements it received by October 1, 2010. As the Charter Schools Division receives additional audited financial statements, this report will be updated and posted on the Georgia Department of Education's website.

Audit Definitions:

Current Ratio- A liquidity ratio that measures an organizations ability to pay short-term obligations. The higher the current ratio, the more capable the organization is of paying its obligations. A ratio under 1 suggests that the company would be unable to pay off its obligations if they came due at that point. While this shows the organization is not in good financial health, it does not necessarily mean that it will go bankrupt - as there are many ways to access financing - but it is definitely not a good sign.

Working Capital- A measure of both a company's efficiency and its short-term financial health. Positive working capital means that the organization is able to pay off its short-term liabilities. Negative working capital means that an organization currently is unable to meet its short-term liabilities with its current assets (cash, accounts receivable and inventory).

Net Assets- the difference between assets (what an organization owns) and liabilities (what an organization owes).

Fund- Often different functions of a state's or local government's activities require different controls for management purposes. To satisfy this need, generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) establish separate accounting entities that are called funds.

Governmental Funds-funds through which most government functions are financed. Only reports Current Assets (CA) and Current Liabilities (CL).

Fund Balance- the difference between Current Assets and Current Liabilities.

Custodial Credit Risk for Deposits- the risk that in the event of bank failure, the School's deposits may not be returned to it. FDIC insurance covers all deposit accounts, including checking and savings accounts, money market deposit accounts and certificates of deposit. FDIC insurance does not cover other financial products and services that banks may offer, such as stocks, bonds, mutual fund shares, life insurance policies, annuities or securities.

The standard insurance amount is \$250,000 per depositor, per insured bank, for each accour ownership category. The custodial credit risk would be for funds above the insured amount
