The Audit Committee shall oversee the work of the Internal Audit Manager, and review, on an ongoing basis, significant internal audit findings and recommendations, the State Auditory audit findings and recommendations, and all other significant audit findings and recommendations. In each review undertaken, the Audit Committee shall likewise review the corrective actions necessary to address the findings and recommendations.
