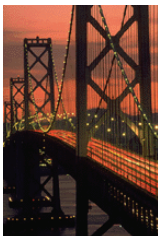

TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION SUPPORT DOCUMENTS

The documents on this CD have been developed to assist Technology Education professionals in their instructional programs. Three documents in Adobe PDF format are included. The first, *Connecting Mathematics and Science to Technology Education*, provides guidance and instructional materials that can be used to support technology education activities related to biological, informational, and physical systems. The second document is *Connecting Reading to Technology Education* and the third is *Connecting Writing to Technology Education*. Materials provided are designed for use at both the middle school and high school levels. Teachers seeking to use the materials should examine the content to determine those

items that would best support their programs.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

The following steps are designed to provide guidance in accessing the materials on CD:

1. Prior to beginning use, please be sure that your computer has the Adobe Acrobat Reader software installed. This software is available at no cost from <http://www.adobe.com/products/acrobat/readstep2.html> if installation is needed.
2. Insert the support documents CD into the CD-ROM drive on your computer.
3. Open *My Computer* and double-click on the CD icon to examine the contents of the CD.
4. Three files are provided on the CD: *math_science_tched.pdf*, *reading_tched.pdf*, *writing_tched.pdf* (Note: the pdf file extensions may not be visible when you examine the contents of the CD.)
5. Double-click on the filename for the document you desire to open.

6. Once the document is open in the Adobe Acrobat Reader, it can be viewed on screen or printed.
7. If printing of selected pages is desired, click the printer icon on the Acrobat toolbar. In the dialogue box that opens, specify the pages that are desired and click OK. The image displayed in the print dialogue box will correspond to the first page indicated and can be used to confirm that the desired pages have been selected for printing.

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
