Compliance: Timelines Summary Report

FY09 Timeline Data

For FY 09, the percentage of initial eligibilities completed on time was 94.15% which was an increase from 89.13%.

For FY 09, the percentage of preschool transitions (BCW) was 97.85% which was an increase from 96.78%.

This was great work by all of you. We have seen significant improvement over the last several years and this data will help our overall determination by the Office of Special Education Programs (US DOE). Thank you for your hard work.

Technical Assistance Data

During FY 09, Systems who were at 85% or below for two consecutive years received technical assistance. Technical assistance was provided to 9 systems for one to three timeline issues. Of those systems, 7 improved to 95% or above, and 2 made substantial progress from the previous year.

Requirements for Noncompliance

According to IDEA, the state must notify LEAs, in writing, of any areas of noncompliance. Systems below 95% will receive a letter of notification of noncompliance including the specific area of the timeline issue(s). These letters will be sent to Superintendents and Special Education Directors by early October.

All systems with less than 95% timeline data must have improvement activities written into their system CLIP. The Division will be conducting verification checks for CLIP improvement activities and some systems will be requested to submit their timeline logs to verify their FY 09 data. Data verifications will be completed for systems that met the 100% target as well as systems that did not meet the target. You will be contacted by the Compliance Review Unit if you need to submit your timeline logs.

Things to Remember about Timeline Reports:

1. Students failing vision or hearing screening is not an acceptable/excusable reason for delayed/late timelines. Systems must review policies, practices, and procedures to correct this problem.
2. Systems should not wait to compile the timeline information until the report due date. Monthly tracking is a must to ensure accurate data and to identify areas for correction. It is important to track the data for allowable exceptions for lateness, number of days late, and reasons for lateness according to the categories listed on the report. Sample monthly tracking logs and individual student tracking logs are available in the attachments and will be available on the GaDOE portal to assist you tracking your timeline data.
3. Timeline data are collected for all initial evaluations to determine eligibility for special education and for all eligibility redeterminations. This includes speech/language and all other eligibilities, including those that do not require a psychological evaluation.

Please note, the state has received notice of changes in timeline calculations. Those changes and additional information related to timelines for FY 10 are included as the attachment to this update. Dispute Resolution Tip

At the beginning of each school year new opportunities for training are scheduled as local systems prepare to update staff with new information, skill sets, and reminders of critical procedures. Working with the parents of special education students to effectively communicate and resolve conflicts as they arise is of utmost importance.

CADRE is funded by the Office of Special Education Programs at the US Department of Education to serve as the National Center on Dispute Resolution in Special Education.

Educational Interpreters who hold an EIPA score of 3.5 or higher meet the credential requirement as defined in State Board Rule 160-4-7-.14. Assessments are being offered around the state at a discounted rate (\$125) for Georgia residents and school system employees. Any candidate may register for the assessment, but professional training and experience are highly recommended. If you were recently assessed with this instrument, you may be subject to a wait period of 6 to 12 months. See www.task12.org. H1N1 (Swine Flu) Guidance

The recent reports of H1N1 (Swine Flu), continue to create some questions and concerns in our school districts. Georgia's Division of Public Health reports that our state continues to have cases of H1N1 and that the current high levels of H1N1 in the southern hemisphere indicate that the virus may become more widespread in our state during the fall and winter. However, current data indicates that the severity of the illness caused by the H1N1 virus is NOT increasing.

The Georgia Department of Education is working very closely with the Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH), particularly Dr. Pat O'Neal, the State Director of Emergency Preparedness, Dr. Susan Lance, the State Epidemiologist, and Michelle Conner, the Director of the Public Health Immunization Program. In accordance with the Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) recommendations, DCH will start a broad campaign soon to encourage Georgia citizens in high risk groups, such as school-age children to get vaccinated.

Please refer to the attached flyer for information and recommendations to share with superintendents and public health officers. It includes information on symptoms, vaccinations, strategies for preventing or reducing the spread of flu, reporting, consideration of school closure, and resources for information or assistance.

Autism Regional Team Meetings:
