# The Purpose of the Grant

- To integrate rigorous technology standards into the K-8 Georgia Performance Standards (GPS) and the Common Core Georgia Performance Standards (CCGPS)



# Grant Goals

- Utilize results of the 21st century skills assessment to increase student mastery of the NETS-S.
- Create elementary and middle school self-funding models to provide students with access to hardware (including netbooks) and digital learning materials that enable college and career readiness.



# Grant Goals

- Implement the K-8 scope and sequence for integrating the NETS-S into the Georgia Performance Standards (GPS) and the Common Core GPS (CCGPS). This integration should include vertical articulation with high school teachers to prepare college and career ready students.



# Grant Goals

- Review, refine, and create NETS-S integrated, GPS/CCGPS based resources that will be custom delivered to teachers' desktops through the State Longitudinal Data System's (SLDS) teacher landing page.

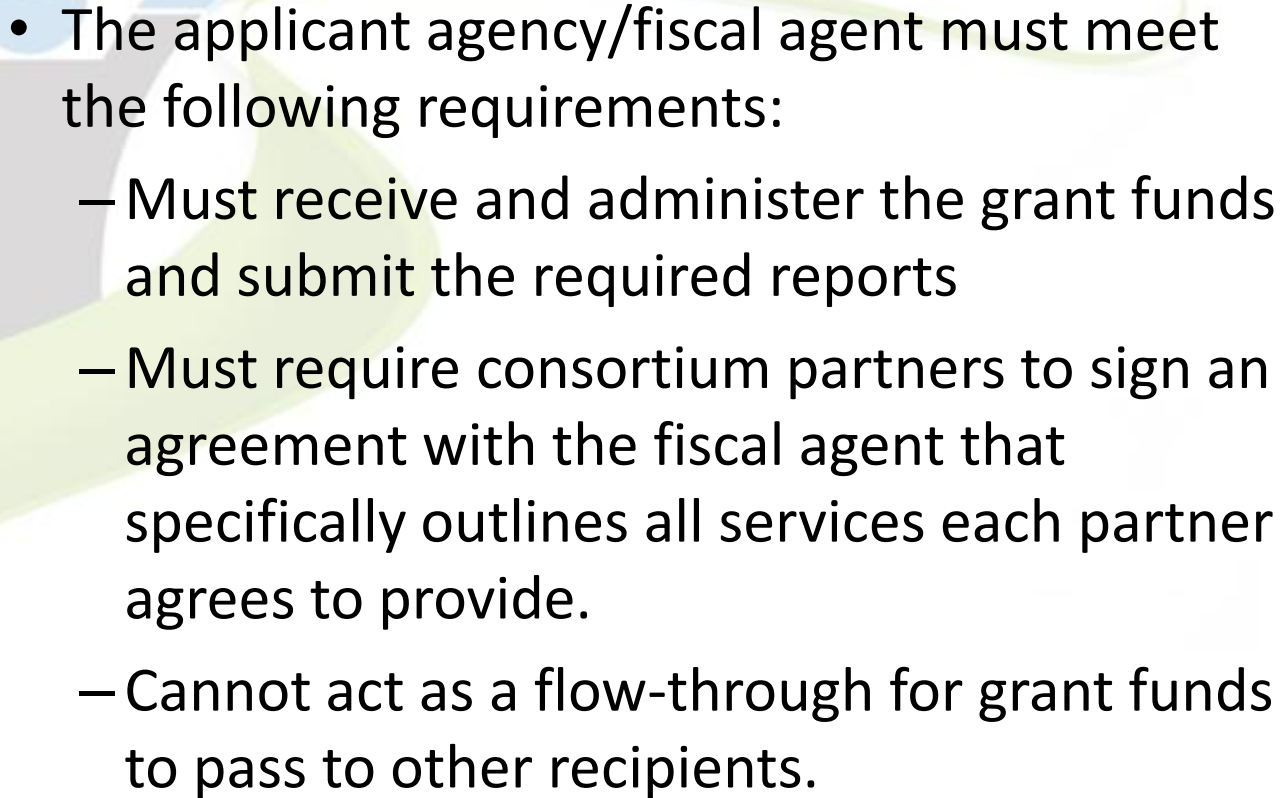

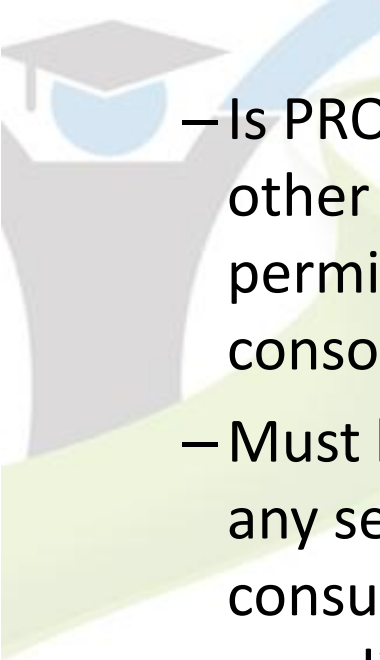


# Consortiums - Overview

- Applicants/participants can form a partnership or consortium to apply for the grant.
- The partnership/consortium must designate one of the applicants/participants to serve as the applicant and fiscal agent for the grant.
- In the event a grant is awarded to a partnership/consortium, the grant or grant contract will be prepared in the name of the applicant agency/fiscal agent.

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- The applicant agency/fiscal agent must meet the following requirements:
    - Must receive and administer the grant funds and submit the required reports
    - Must require consortium partners to sign an agreement with the fiscal agent that specifically outlines all services each partner agrees to provide.
    - Cannot act as a flow-through for grant funds to pass to other recipients.





- Is PROHIBITED from sub-granting funds to other recipients. The fiscal agent is permitted to contract for services with other consortium partners.
- Must be responsible for the performance of any services provided by the partners, consultants, or other organizations and must coordinate how each plan to participate.

# Private School Consultation

- MUST occur before grant is written
- MUST include information on funds generated by the private school
- MUST include information about equal services, including PD and equipment (all equipment remains the property of the LEA)
- MUST have documentation of consultation



# Professional Development

- A minimum of 35% must be spent on PD.
- An LEA may spend more than 35% on PD.
- PD should include
  - Technical training (use of equipment)
  - NETS-S (technology standards/integration)
  - Creating NETS-S aligned tasks/lesson plans



# Budget

- Preliminary budget required – Why?
- Final budgets will be due after awards are made



# The Application Process

- VERIFY that all required documentation and signatures are included.
- Scan the application to PDF.
- Add FY11 Competitive Grant to ConApps
- Upload grant application as an attachment
- Read and accept program assurances

  - Staff available for questions regarding grant specifics
- ETC/RESA
  - Experience with writing and implementing grants



# Timeline

- March 9\*: Applications due (with budget )  
\*Note: This is a change from the original due date of March 4<sup>th</sup>.
- March 14-25: Scoring & Interviews
- April 14: Awardees named
- May 13: Budgets due in ConApp
- May 31: Summer PD planned
- September 1: 1<sup>st</sup> Quarterly report due
- September 30: Equipment purchases complete
- The implementation period for this grant will be the 2011/12, 2012/13, and 2013/14 school years.



# Important Information

- Incomplete applications will NOT be scored.
- Top scoring applicants will participate in interviews for additional points.
  - Participating schools/teachers should be very familiar with your application



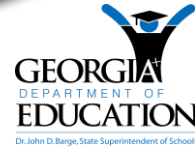

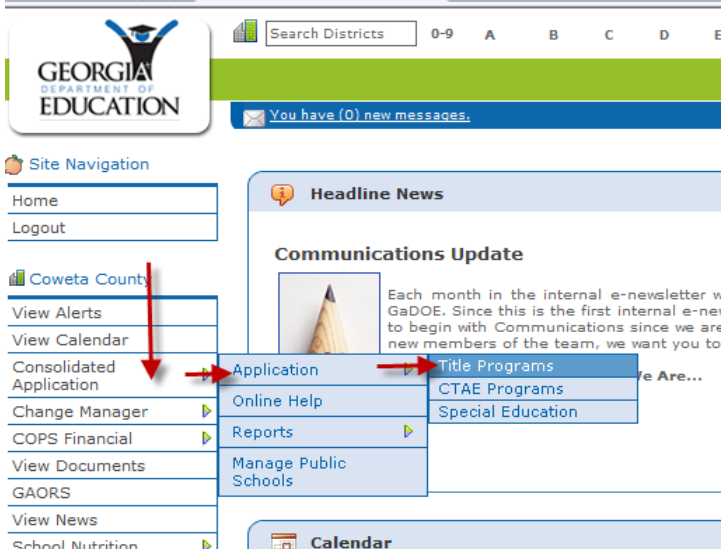

# Submitting Your Application

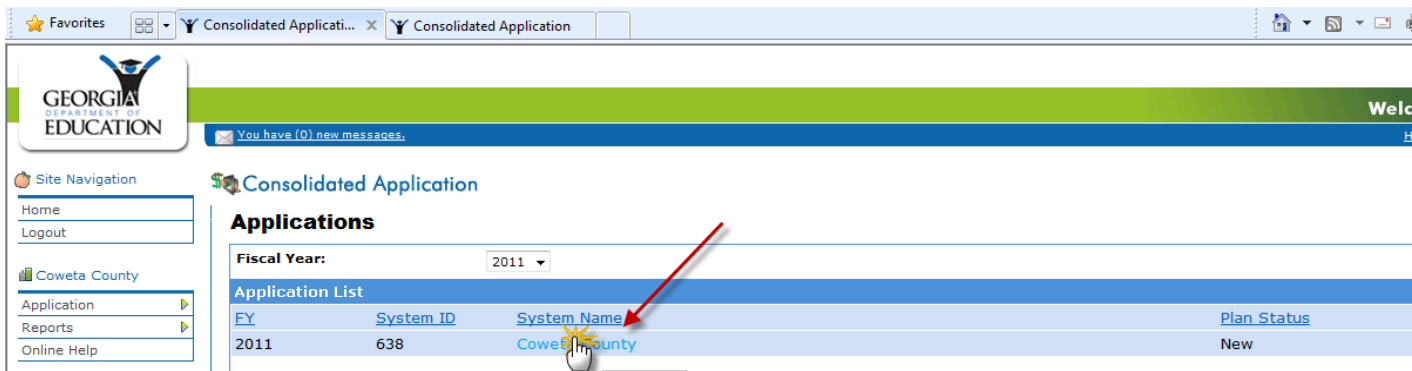
- Someone at the District level will need to add the grant program in the Consolidated Application.

##### General Assurances
